REPORT ON *One Day State Level Webinar on 'MORAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF YOUNG PROFESSIONALS'* on 18th MAY 2022 ORGANIZED BY CAREER COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL IN COLLABORATION WITH DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY; DURGAPUR GOVERNMENT COLLEGE.

TITLE OF THE WEBINAR: *'MORAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF YOUNG PROFESSIONALS'*

THEME OF THE WEBINAR: The theme of the webinar centered round a Moral question which has two manifestations namely what are the moral responsibilities of the employer or the company and what are the moral obligations of the young inexperienced professional. The young professionals of tomorrow need to know both their responsibilities and the moral obligations of the company /institutions. It was obligatory on the part of the members of the Cell to conduct a Webinar on Moral Responsibility and to conduct it well the Cell decided to take help of the Department of Philosophy, Durgapur Government College. The administration of a Company /Institution may take different approaches to look after the welfare of the employees. The Company requires considering all possible consequences before it takes a decision so that the least possible harm be incurred. It must also take into consideration whether the decisions it is about to take is kind, compassionate and fair for all stakeholders. Moreover whether the Company is performing all its social responsibilities and duties which it is expected to perform is also a prime concern.

OBJECTIVE OF THE WEBINAR: The Career Counselling and placement Cell found that it is not only that the fundamentals of Business Ethics but definitely the Philosophical theories on Moral responsibility which must be conveyed to the students in order to make the whole journey of delivering effective message turns out to be a success. The Philosophical problem of how far are we morally responsible for our actions performed if there is no Freewill since all our actions are causally determined has baffled Philosophers for a long time. It must all the more be considered as a true belief that a philosophical theory is always for the man practicing his life habits, customs and traditions to lead a peaceful life. Philosophers for sure have never tried to only raise an argument but they had only shown us the mirror of truth. The decisions that a person makes are the consequence of his desires, circumstances and dispositions; when actually a person feels that what he does is a free act. The truth in fact is that an act is always conditioned.

The two implausible alternatives of our being morally responsible or not are:

1. People have free will and are not determined by any circumstances
2. People do not have a free will; in that case he is not morally responsible for what he does.

The question may be how does a young professional still unaware of the many duties perform morally and be found to be either morally responsible or otherwise?

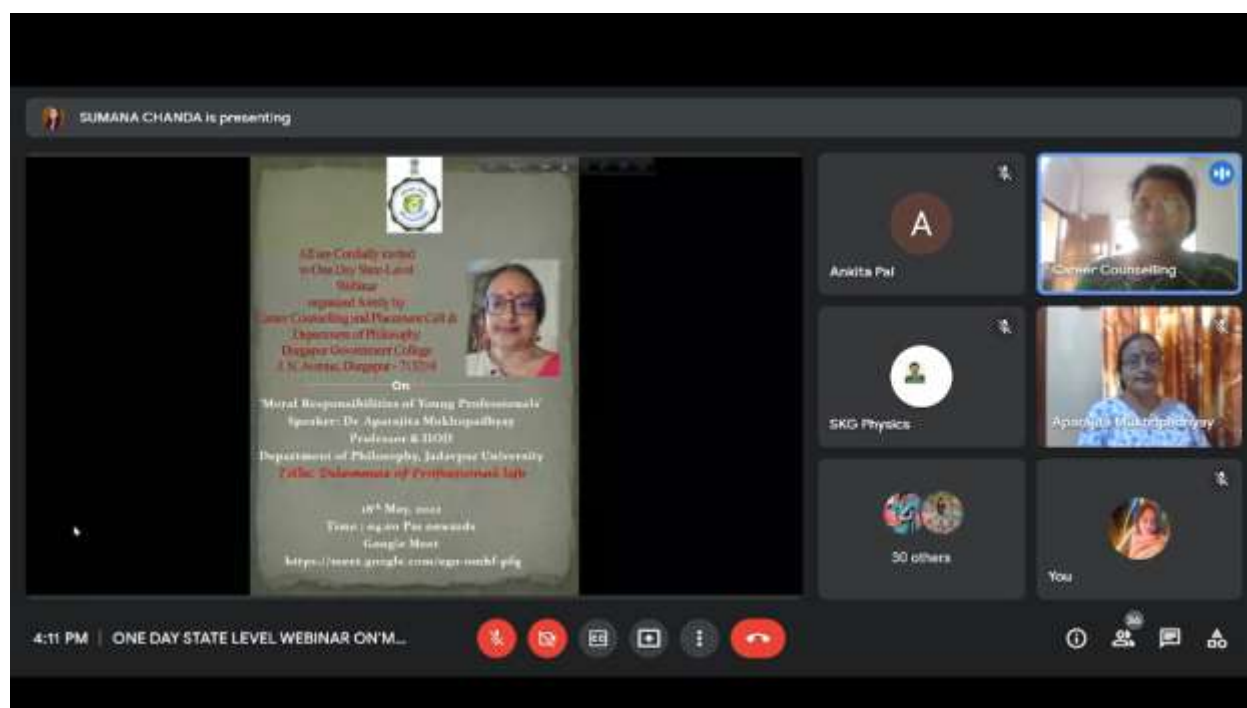

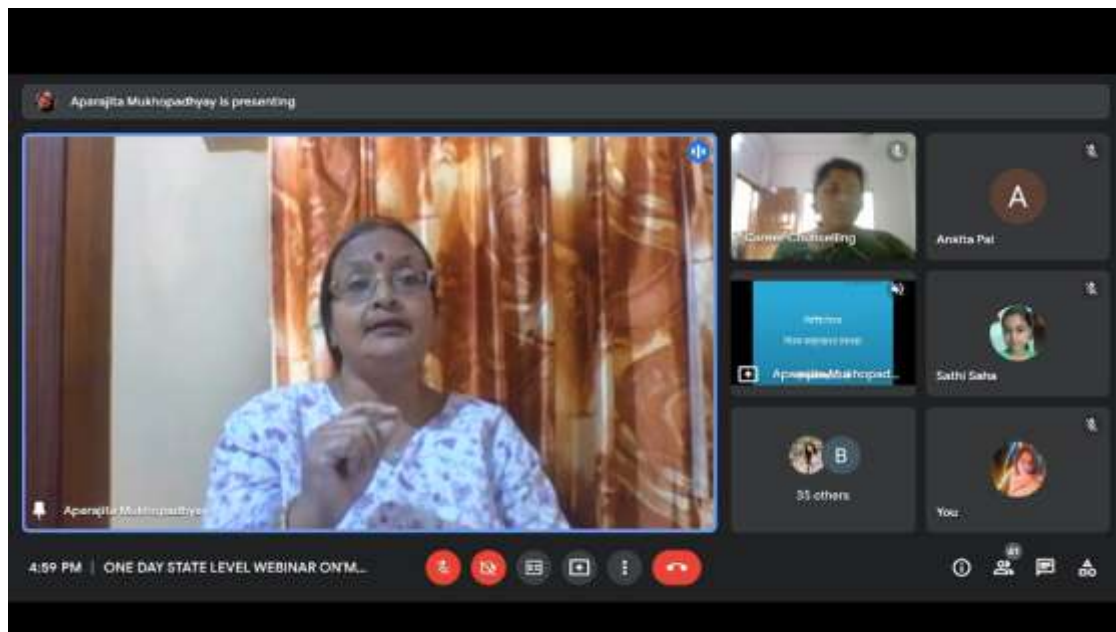
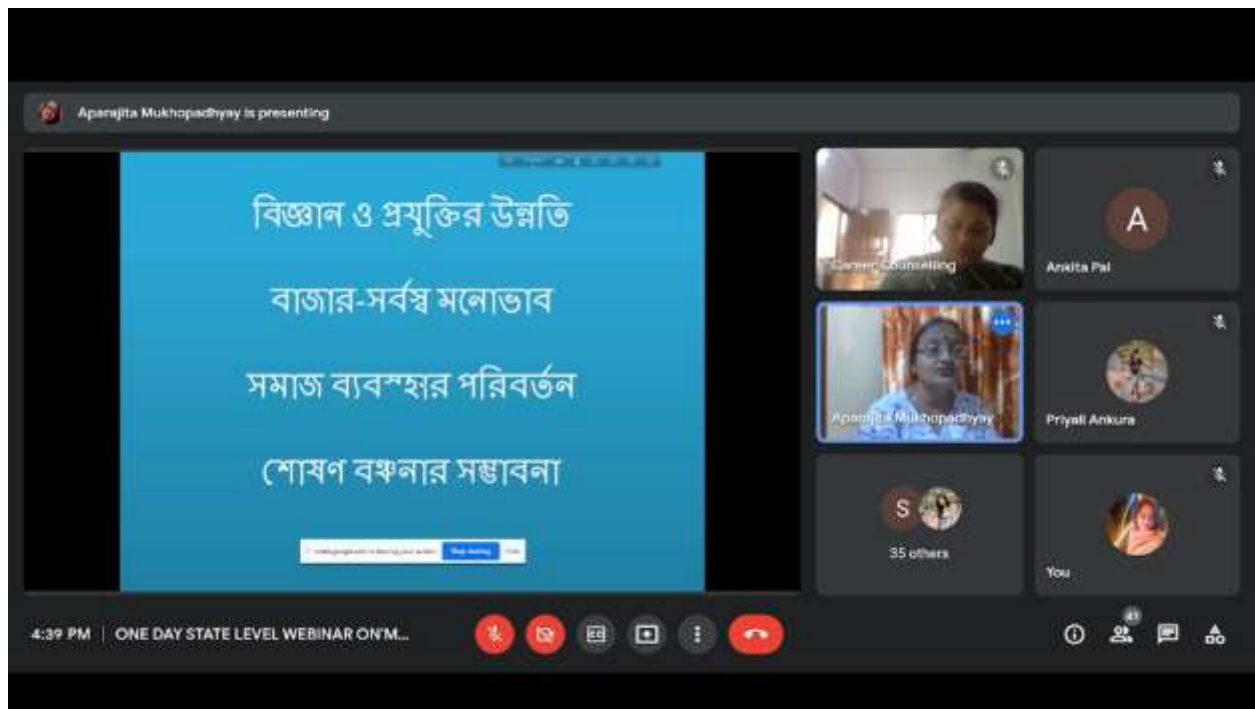

Dr. Aparajita Mukhopadhyay explained that both the employer and the employee (if it is the case of a company) must be responsible so that the work be done. Now are we to distinguish between ordinary responsibility and moral responsibility? The question in itself is overlapping and puts us in between the horns of a Dilemma. The question of Moral responsibility arises when there is a question of enacting on grounds of being dutiful. We for many a times feel that we should have chosen a second option of behaving but since we are bound to act being restricted by our duty to our profession we could not do otherwise. We for most of the cases might feel that our Freedom of will is curtailed and Determinism prevails. Determinism is a Philosophical theory where your act and you as a moral agent is bracketed by some prerequisite condition. When it comes to young professionals then this Determinism either results in frustration and low percentage of Job satisfaction which ultimately leads to

indecision. The solution that Philosophers may provide is that one must come out of individual good and well being and think for the well being of the society or the well being of all. Society will progress only if we render our service in a selfless way. If we consider the greater benefit our rendering service then the issue and ill feeling of being determined where individual freedom is curbed will be overcome. It will then be quality service for a greater period of time.



Dr. Aparajita Mukhopadhyay is seen conversing with a Fourth Semester Hons student Poulumi Ganguly. Poulumi was curious to know that how a person does adjust with his reactions the whole day through; being Professional with his Colleagues and being Unprofessional with his family members. She explained her point by saying that if there are demands of the Profession and thereby of the society then there are demands on the family front as well. Are we not doing our duty for the duty's sake and giving it the name of Moral responsibility. The answer suggested by our honorable speaker was; it all depends on us and on our honesty towards our profession or towards our family. Performing one's duty should give the same feeling to a person. One would not feel the change if duty comes first or is prior to ego issues. Moral responsibilities actually has no perfect locus to be acted upon. It is we who fall in Dilemmas; but there is no reason that to consider Dilemmas as the ultimate truth of life. Moreover success should not be measured in terms of position gained in a profession it must rather be weighed in terms of the good feeling or satisfaction that one gets in being sincere to one's job. The balance therefore is important and it is also true that sometimes losing balance is quite humane.
