


June 2022 to December 2022




Sanchita Das of 3rd Semester History (Hons) secured the second prize in Poster Competition on this theme.

Visit to a different kind of Museum

On December 1, 2022, the 5th Semester (Hons) students were taken to the Setubandha Museum, located in the Vidyacharcha Bhavan of the Kazi Nazrul University. The museum is the brain child of faculty members of the English department of Kazi Nazrul University, in assistance with The Asansol Heritage Research Group, a collective of independent researchers of this country and abroad. The museum is created to bridge the gaps between our past, present and future and the curator Dr Santanu Banerjee graciously gave us a lively demonstration lecture on the exhibits and how they are collected. It gave the students an idea of the continuously changing scenario around them and how to preserve slices of these. It made them aware

of the heritages around the Asansol-Raniganj-Durgapur belt and the need to protect and preserve them.
