viewers in recent times.

opportunity to participate in a discussion with historian Ranabir Chakraborty, who was presiding over the session.



ALPANA COMPETITION IN COLLEGE PREMISES





On 4th May, two local groups performed two short plays on mythological and classical themes on the college auditorium, which was attended by a large number of students of our department.






Special Lecture organized under Departmental Initiative
