CIRCULAR

Subject: Implementation of the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 9 of the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013, all the State Higher Educational Institutions coming under the purview of the aforesaid Act and the Rules are hereby informed that they shall take immediate steps in implementing the provisions of the Act and the Rules so that reservation in all categories is given effect from the academic session 2014-15 by increasing the number of seats, within the available infrastructure.

During allocation of seats to each reserved category as defined under the Act, it shall be kept in mind by every institution that the percentage of reservation applicable to each reserved category (SC-22%, ST-6%) under the Act, shall be in commensurate with the overall number of seats being increased in each course/ faculty. For OBC-A (10%) and OBC-B (7%) seats, implementation will be done over a six year period commencing from 2014-15.

Every such institution is accordingly directed to submit a detailed proposal as per the Proforma enclosed within one month of issue of this circular.

MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT : Reservation of Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) in admission in the Higher Educational Institution in the State of West Bengal.

In order to enable the Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) who do not come within the purview of the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2013, to receive the benefits of admission to Higher Educational Institution, the Government of West Bengal in Higher Education Department have decided to provide the benefit of admission to higher educational institutions in commensurate with the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, *read* with O.M No. 325-PAR (AR)/3P-1/2019 Dated 09.07.2019 of Personnel & Administrative Reforms Department, Government of West Bengal, *read* with Memo No. 959-BCW/MR-52/2019 Dated 18.05.2023 of Backward Classes Welfare Department, Government of West Bengal, subject to a maximum limit of ten percent of total number of seats in each category. This will not, however, apply to the Minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution of India.

2. The reservation norms shall apply to the State educational institutions under the Higher Education Department of Government of West Bengal at once and it shall be applicable to :-
- (a) all Universities, established and incorporated by an Act of the State Legislature and aided fully or partly out of the State's fund;
 - (b) all Government colleges established or administered by the State Government whether directly or indirectly, and affiliated to a University;

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- (c) all colleges receiving aid from the State Government in any form or in any manner, whether fully or partly;
- (d) all unaided/private colleges and private universities incorporated by an Act of State Legislature; and
- (e) all other institutions imparting education or training or research or other academic activities beyond 10+2 level and receiving aid from the State Government in any form or in any manner, whether fully or partly;
- (f) “State Government” means the State Government of West Bengal in the Higher Education Department.
3. The Provision of reservations to the Economically Weaker Sections shall be in accordance with the directions contained in O.M No 325-PAR (AR)/3P-1/2019 Dated 09.07.2019 of Personnel & Administrative Reforms Department, Government of West Bengal read with Memo No. 959-BCW/MR-52/2019 Dated 18.05.2023 of Backward Classes Welfare Department, Government of West Bengal and shall be subject to the following :
- (a) Every Higher Educational Institution shall, with the approval of the appropriate authority, make endeavour to increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty so that the number of seats available, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the EWSs, is not less than the number of such seats available, in each category, for the academic session immediately preceding the date of the coming into force of this Memorandum.
- (b) Where necessary, in order to enable the Higher Educational Institutions to create the physical, academic and other infrastructure so as to cater to the increase in the number of seats, a maximum period of two years beginning with the academic session following the commencement of this Memorandum shall be allowed, and the extent of reservation for the Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) shall be limited for that academic session in such manner that the number of seats made available to the Economically Weaker Sections for each academic session shall not reduce the number and the percentage of reservations provided for SC/ST/OBC categories.
- (c) In respect of those Higher Educational Institutions where expansion of capacity is not feasible for want of adequate infrastructure or for other reasons, the State Government may, upon being satisfied, re-distribute its quota of stream-wise reserved seats to other institutions in such a manner and to such extent as may be practicable keeping in mind the total seats available for all Higher Educational Institutions in the State taken together for a particular academic session.
- (d) For filling up of the seats for admission in a particular academic session the following procedure shall be followed :-
- (i) a general merit list based exclusively on merit irrespective of castes, tribes or classes shall be prepared separately for each course, stream or subject in each Higher Educational Institution to fill up the unreserved seats. Separate merit list of the Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) candidates shall be prepared for each course/stream/subject in each higher educational institution to fill up the seats reserved for these respective categories.
- (ii) In any case, if a candidate obtains marks lower than the minimum qualifying marks prescribed by the University/ Appropriate Authority for admission to the relevant course, he will not be eligible for admission;
- (iii) If the reserved seats remain unfilled due to non availability of reserved category candidates, such seats shall be taken up for de-reservation in such manner as may be decided by the Backward Classes Welfare Department;
- (iv) In every case of admission to general degree courses, technical, professional and post graduate level courses, the EWS certificate issued by the Competent Authority in Government of West Bengal shall be verified by the concerned Higher Educational Institution at the time of admission.
- (e) Where reservation of seats for one or many programmes or streams in a particular academic session remains unfilled, the following procedure of de-reservation shall be followed :-
- (i) If, after duly entertaining all applications to fill up reserved seats, it is found that some seats reserved for the Economically weaker Section (EWSs) remain unfilled during the academic session for want of suitable number of candidates from the respective categories, those seats may be de-reserved and filled up by general candidates where it is specified that due process for filling up of the seats by the candidates

of the specific categories have been followed by the institutions concerned and no suitable candidate of the reserved categories is available to fill up those seats. No vacant reserved seat shall be carried forward to the next academic year, under any circumstances;

- (ii) the Higher Educational Institutions seeking de-reservation shall submit, a statement giving the following particulars :—
- (1) number of candidates who have applied for admission giving break up of Unreserved, Economically weaker Section (EWSs) applicants separately for respective Courses/Streams/Subjects;
 - (2) number of seats reserved for Economically weaker Section (EWSs), for such category of Course/Stream/Subject;
 - (3) number of candidates qualifying for admission and admitted, as such, from reserved category against respective Programmes/Streams/Subjects;
 - (4) the Higher Educational Institutions shall also furnish copies of their admission Notice(s) to show whether, for issue of Forms to Economically weaker Section (EWSs) candidates, the minimum prescribed marks of the Board, Council or University had been indicated, as the qualifying marks for getting admission Forms against the reserved seats.
- (f) The Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal shall have power to give directions to every State-aided University or State-aided Colleges or Institutions to achieve the objectives of this Memorandum and also to entrust them with such duties and functions as it may deem necessary.
- (g) In case the number of seats reserved for the Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) in Post-graduate and Doctoral courses is less than 0.5 in each stream, a 100 point roster for admission as notified by Labour Department vide No. 50-EMP/1M-25/98 Dated 01.03.2011 read with Notification No. 18-Emp (EC)/LABR-27011(20)/1/2020-EC Dated 07.02.2023 shall be followed so far as admission to Higher Educational Institution is concerned.
- (h) A person belonging to EWS cannot be denied the right to compete for admission against an unreserved vacancy. Person belonging to EWS who will be selected on the basis of merit and not on account of reservation will not be counted towards the quota meant for reservation.
- (i) EWS certificate is valid for the financial year of issuance of certificate.
- (j) An officer not below the rank of Joint Secretary in the Higher Education Department shall act as nodal officer to monitor the implementation of reservation for EWS category.

Subject: Procedure to be followed for reservation of persons with disabilities for admission.

Ref: Guidelines of Department of Personnel and Training, Govt. of India

Sir,

In reference to the above mentioned subject I am directed to enclose the FAQ issued by the Department of Personnel and Training, Government of India regarding reservation of the persons with disabilities as per the provisions of the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995.

In this regard I am further directed to say that reservation of seats shall not exceed 45% (SC-22%, ST-6%, OBC-A- 10% & OBC-B-7%). Persons with disabilities will enjoy a 3% reservation in each of the categories, i.e. in SC, ST, OBC-A, OBC-B and in the Unreserved or General Category, and such candidates, if available, shall be placed towards the top of the list prepared for each category of students.

Our College

The foundation stone of Durgapur Government College was laid by Shri Dharma Vira, the then Governor of West Bengal, on January 22, 1969 as the follow-up of an effort to set up a co-educational government-funded institution of higher education at the gradually emerging industrial town of Durgapur. In 1969, the College, besides being the first institution of its kind in town, was the only Government College not only in the home district of Burdwan (now officially known as Paschim Bardhaman), but also in the neighbouring districts of Bankura, Purulia and Birbhum. The institution presently continues its singularity in being the sole public funded college in Durgapur.

The academic journey of Durgapur Government College started on September 15, 1970, in the academic session 1970-71 with B.A. Honours courses in six subjects: English, Economics, History, Political Science, Philosophy, and Sanskrit. Bengali was offered as a subject in the B.A. Pass course. Although the College initially offered Humanities courses, it gradually expanded its horizon through the introduction of subjects in demand and now offers quality education in Humanities, Science and Commerce streams. Presently, the college offers **undergraduate Honours and Undergraduate courses in 14 subjects of Humanities, Science and Commerce streams** and post-graduate courses in three Science subjects, namely **Chemistry, Conservation Biology and Geology**. The Department of Conservation Biology is one of its kind in eastern India while the Department of Geology is among the very few departments to offer the subject in West Bengal. The college has also recently received the approval of the University to offer **Ph.D. Undergraduates in Conservation Biology, Chemistry and Geology**. The institution was affiliated to The University of Burdwan since its inception till June 23, 2015 and subsequently to the newly set up Kazi Nazrul University (KNU), Asansol since June 24, 2015 by Government order.

In the academic session, 2016-17, the affiliating University (Kazi Nazrul University) implemented the **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)** for all courses as per UGC recommendations. In accordance with outcome-based education, KNU has also introduced the **learning outcome based curriculum framework (LOCF)** within the CBCS from the 2020-21 academic session.

The institution envisions cultivating students with the best education possible, instilling values to go forth into the world as good human beings, equipped to meet the challenges of the world outside the campus walls. Though Durgapur houses a number of government-aided and private colleges at present, Durgapur Government College continues to function as the only public-funded institution in Durgapur offering degrees primarily at the undergraduate level at nominal tuition fees, with an aim to include and empower students from various categories of society and from remote rural areas.

Cultivating the sense of discipline and dedication in addition to the intellectual, moral and cultural development of the students is the overall mission of Durgapur Government College. Dedicated faculty members try their best to help students to keep in sync with the competitive world by providing quality higher education to ensure their smooth absorption into the subsequent phases of life. The focus is on overall personality and skill development in a healthy academic atmosphere inside classrooms and on campus. A lot of thought goes in organizing activities for cohesion among staff and students hailing from diverse socio-cultural and economic background.

Durgapur Government College was accredited by the **National Assessment and**

Accreditation Council (NAAC) with "A" Grade in 2017. More than 65 students have passed **Joint Admission Test for M.Sc. (JAM) examinations** with all India ranks in the last four years and our students have been placed for higher studies in **IITs, IISER** and other institutes of national repute. Our students have also shown outstanding performances in district, state and national sports tournaments and students of our **NCC unit have been placed in the armed forces.**

Presently, the education sector is one of the worst affected segments due to COVID-19 and online platforms have consequently assimilated into the mainstream dialogue of content delivery and evaluation. In the present pandemic situation, our institution has sincerely delivered the curricular aspects through online mode and also organized webinars focussed on the advanced subject knowledge and interpersonal skills thereby achieving the cognitive and non-cognitive learning outcomes. We have also worked to improve the technological competence of our students through **soft skill training webinars and expert lectures on career prospects** organized by the Career Counselling and Placement Cell. Our students have also participated in online cultural Undergraduates to celebrate important occasions and we have also organized training Undergraduates and webinar on "Yoga" for our students, faculty members and staff. Our students have also worked sincerely through the **National Service Scheme (NSS)** for social welfare in the present pandemic situation.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) designs the effective mechanism to promote conscious, consistent and catalytic action plans for the improvement of the academic and administrative performance of the institution. We provide support and guidance to our students through different support services as follows:

- **Ragging-free campus:** The Anti-ragging Committee along with Anti-ragging Squad of the college ensures zero tolerance to ragging in the college campus and organizes awareness campaigns.
- **Nominal fee structure:** The college, directly governed by the Higher Education Department and the Education Directorate, Government of the West Bengal, offers UG and PG degrees at a nominal fee structure.
- **Scholarships for students:** The institution provides all sorts of assistance to students to apply for different Government Scholarship Schemes.
- **Career Counselling and Placement Cell:** We help the students to become leaders in their careers and communities by preparing themselves for lifelong professional success with a sense of confidence, optimism and happiness. The cell organizes department specific lectures on career prospects by renowned academicians and also focuses on the skill development of students.
- **Internal Complaints Committee:** This committee organizes Undergraduates on gender sensitization, conducts campaigns and workshops among students to make them aware of the evils of gender discrimination and the ways to alleviate them so as to create a balanced and equitable working environment for all.
- **COVID-19 Grievance Redressal Cell:** Keeping in view the present pandemic situation, the COVID-19 Grievance Redressal Cell was constituted in 2020 to look after the student grievances related to examinations and other academic activities of the college during COVID-19 Pandemic.
- **Grievance Redressal Cell:** The Cell addresses the grievances of all stakeholders of this institution.

UG Regulation of Kazi Nazrul University Regulations relating to UG Courses of Studies and Examinations

Courses of Study

There shall be **two types of degrees** in the field of Arts, Science and Commerce.

Honours degree shall be of **eight semesters (four years)** duration.

Undergraduate degree shall be of **six semesters (three years)** duration.

The admission to these courses of study will be governed by the **guidelines of the Kazi Nazrul University** and the **Higher Education Department of Government of West Bengal** as and when framed.

A Candidate shall be allowed to pursue any one of the Degree courses of the University **(not more than one) at a time.**

Curriculum and Credit Framework:

In pursuance of National Curriculum and Credit Framework for UG courses proposed under National Education Policy 2022, Kazi Nazrul University has provided the credit framework for 3 years undergraduate course and 4 years Honours courses as follows:

A student of **Honours Course** has to complete **173 credits in eight semesters** and similarly a student of **Undergraduate Course** has to complete **126 credits in six semesters.**

Honours degree will be awarded with research or without research depending on the curriculum selected in the fourth year (7th and 8th semester).

Under Honours and Undergraduate Courses, there shall be different types of courses as follows:

- A) Major Course:** A major course is the subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that subject.
- B) Minor Course:** A minor course helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major course.
- C) Multidisciplinary Course:** Multidisciplinary courses are intended to broaden the intellectual experience and form a part of liberal arts and science education.
- D) Ability Enhancement Course:** These courses will help the student to achieve competency in a modern Indian language and English language with emphasis on language and communication skill.
- E) Skill Enhancement Course:** These courses are aimed to impart practical skills, hands on training, soft skills and hence to enhance employability of the student.
- F) Value Added Course:** These courses enable student to gain a more holistic perspective and thus a better understanding of current industry challenges, as well as to gain and develop innovative and creative skills through a diverse range of course offerings.
- G) Summer Internship or Apprenticeship:** These courses are aimed to familiarize the students into actual work situations and hence to enhance employability of the student.

The distribution of courses in different components for both Honours and undergraduate courses of studies are summarized in **Table 1**

Campus at a glance

Library

The College Library serves as a repository of knowledge and plays a significant role in the academic excellence of the institution. The central library of Durgapur Government College was started with about 575 books in 1971. Presently, it has a rich collection of 80,000 printed books on various disciplines, CD/DVDs, journals, encyclopaedia, developmental reports and audio-visual equipment. The Library Building is located adjacent to the Administrative Building which is the centre of the college campus. It occupies about 517 sq. metre and also provides reading room facility. The Library is also used as a space for open-house discussions. The central library is provided with proper ventilation, lighting & fans/AC and CCTV Surveillance. Every department has its own departmental library for easy and quick access to course-wise specialized documents.

Laboratory and Central Instrumentation Facility

The institution offers UG and PG courses in eight science subjects. The Departments of Botany, Chemistry, Conservation Biology, Geology, Physics and Zoology have well-equipped practical laboratories to cater to the experiential learning experiences of students. The DST-FIST sponsored Central Instrumentation facility has also been developed to provide advanced equipment facility.

Computer Facility

The institution aims to provide ample opportunities of computational skill development to students and faculty members. A central computer laboratory with power backup is available in the main academic building for students. Practical classes of the Department of Commerce and Mathematics are conducted in the laboratory. Departments of Chemistry and Physics have separate computer laboratories for students. The central library also provides computer access to students. Faculty members can access computer and internet facilities in the departments, Teachers' room, Central library and Office of the Principal. The institution also provides smart classroom facilities with overhead projectors, retractable screens and internet connection either through Wi-Fi or through LAN. LCD Projectors and laptop computers are available in the departments.

Hostel Facility

As per Government initiative two separate hostels for boys and girls students have been constructed within the college campus ensuring in-campus security and facilities. The final renovation of these hostels is in progress and once completed interested students will be accommodated in those.

NSS

The NSS wing of the institution has been very active since its inception in 1972 and has a very glorious past. NSS has two units with a volunteer base of around hundred students in each unit belonging to Humanities, Science and Commerce streams respectively. Unit 1 was opened in 1972 and Unit 2 was opened in the year 2008. The NSS units adopt villages to ensure the overall development of the neighbouring areas. NSS volunteers work sincerely to

ensure a clean and plastic free college campus. Cleaning and education awareness program are carried throughout the year. Different activities include campus cleaning, afforestation Undergraduates, health awareness Undergraduate like AIDS awareness, Pulse Polio and Immunization Works, Literacy Undergraduates, Blood Donation and Blood Group Checking Camps and many such important activities. During the academic session 2022-23, apart from the regular activities of NSS such as tree plantation, campus cleaning and celebration of Independence Day, Republic Day, "World Environment Day" and International Yoga Day, NSS has celebrated NSS Day successfully followed by an orientation Undergraduate with newly selected volunteers of the college. NSS volunteers also took part in the Road Painting Competition in the Durgapur Government College and successfully organized a seven-day camp from 3rd to 9th April, 2023. In the camp, different lectures were arranged and eminent speakers shared their knowledge. Workshops on handicrafts were also arranged. Visits to adopted villages were carried out with an aim to generate awareness about hygiene and sanitation, especially sanitary hygiene for women. Surveys in those villages were carried out regarding the availability of different govt. facilities and other Undergraduates. Children of the villages were given free classes and a drawing competition with exciting prizes was also arranged on the last day of the camp.

NCC

Durgapur Government College houses an active NCC Unit. Cadets of the college NCC unit take part in different camps organized by NCC authority a) Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC) b) Annual training Camp (ATC) c) Republic Day Camp (RDC) d) Thal Sainik Camp (TSC) e) National Integration Camp (NIC) f) Army Attachment Camp (AAC) g) Trekking camp h) Rock Climbing Camp (RCC) i) All India GV Mavlankar Shooting Championship j) Youth Exchange Programme (YEP). In these camps, rigorous physical training is imparted to the cadets with a view to increase their physical endurance. During Military training, cadets acquire first-hand knowledge about the use of various devices used by the Army. They are also trained in self-defence, map reading, first aid and shooting. Cultural Undergraduates are held during training periods for improving the cultural and social outlook of the cadets. They also have to participate in various social activities to get the feeling of belonging to the society. Apart from these, cadets also join the adventure activities such as Mountaineering, Rock Climbing; Ice skating, Trekking etc. NCC team regularly participates in the formal Sub Division level Guard of Honour on 26th January and 15th August to commemorate the Republic Day and Independence Day of India and almost every year perform outstandingly. NCC cadets also participate in the march-past during the college sports. NCC Cadets celebrate "National Yoga Day" in the college campus. Our NCC students have joined the army, RPF, CRPF, CISF, BSF, SSB, air force, West Bengal Police Service. During the 2022-23 academic session, the NCC unit performed a wide range of activities namely, Independence Day Celebration, Traffic Control Duty during Durga Puja and Kali Puja, Participation of cadets in Shooting Competition, Special ALC camp, Rock Climbing Course and Basic Mountaineering Course at HMI, Celebration of NCC Day, Celebration of Birth anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Republic Day Celebration and parade, Black Day Observation, Celebration of Kargil Vijay Divas, Statue and College Campus Cleaning Undergraduate, Rally on World Earth Day, Tree Plantation Undergraduate, Awareness Rally on World Environment Day, Celebration of International Yoga Day etc.

ICC

The College has an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), constituted with a view to provide protection against discrimination and sexual harassment of women employees and girl students and for the prevention, prohibition and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment in all forms and at all levels of the Institution. This cell had been functioning since 2006 was reformed and the ICC was constituted in 2018 as per the Government guidelines. The ICC publicly notifies the provisions against sexual harassment and ensures their wider dissemination across the campus. It looks into individual complaints and conducts independent inquiry based on evidences and investigation and makes appropriate recommendations. The ICC also organizes seminars/workshops/campaigns/interactive sessions on relevant issues throughout the academic session besides sensitizing the students about their rights, entitlements and responsibilities enshrined in the "Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013". The ICC publicly commits itself to adopt a zero-tolerance policy towards sexual harassment and strives to create a campus free from discrimination and sexual harassment. A gender sensitization week was conducted from 9th to 12th February, 2023 and each stream namely science, arts and commerce were individually addressed to make students aware of the necessity and working of the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) of Durgapur Government college. The women's day was commemorated with an appealing presentation by Dr Anwesha Sengupta, Assistant Professor, Jadavpur University on "Women and Partition", jointly organised by the Dept of Bengali, Philosophy and History in collaboration with ICC, Durgapur Government College on the 25th of March, 2023.

IQAC

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell, established on July 02, 2007, following the first cycle of assessment and accreditation of Durgapur Government College by the NAAC Peer Team in 2007, bridges the academic and administrative wings of the College, framing and implementing policies to ensure steady and sure steps to stay in sync with the demands of a fast-changing world in which the stakeholders move and work. With a focus on inclusive education and encouragement of innovative teaching methods especially in a digital age, the IQAC is on its toes round the year to offer the best available infrastructure to its stakeholders. The maintaining and sustaining of excellence being the priority of the IQAC, it works in formal and informal ways to create a work-atmosphere beneficial for all.

Career Counselling and Placement Cell

The career counselling and Placement Cell organizes different career counselling sessions and webinars pertinent to provide career guidance and enhance the IT skills and technological competency of students. Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Ragging Squad

The Anti-ragging committee along with Anti-Ragging Squad has been formed strictly following the UGC regulations to ensure zero tolerance to ragging in the college campus. The Committee and Squad work sincerely to provide a ragging free atmosphere in the college campus.

Students' Union

Students' representation and engagement in college activities is a significant aspect of participative management and the institution effectively ensures active students' contribution in the institutional functioning through the "Students Union". Students have the liberty to communicate the requests and feedback through periodic conversations with the college authority. Students' representation and engagement in the regular college activities ensures a democratic and student friendly academic environment in the institution. Observance of important days such as "Birthday of Swami Vivekananda", "Republic Day", "International Mother language Day", "Rabindra Jayanti", "Nazrul Jayanti", "Independence Day", and other cultural programmes such as "Students' Felicitation programme" and "Road Art Competition" are organized by students in the college premises. This ensures their holistic development by cultivating their organizational skills and motivating them with the feeling of togetherness and team work. "Basanta Utsab" is organized and celebrated in the college premises by students to cultivate a sense of respect for Indian culture and tradition. Every year, students' union organizes annual college exhibitions in the college campus, which also involves an interdepartmental competition and thereafter prize distribution. Students showcase their creative impulses through such competitions in the form of posters, models, charts etc. Students Union also actively participates in the activities organized by the two NSS units inside the college premises and all social welfare activities in the locality.

Sports

Sports activities of the college deserves special mention. The college campus, spread over 25 acres is studded with playgrounds to provide ample opportunities for sports activities. Students of the college have shown outstanding performance at the university/district/state level tournaments. Separate common room is available for male and female students. Indoor games available in common room are Table Tennis, Carrom and Chess. The Department of Physical Education provides all possible support and encouragement to students for participation in sports and games. Every year students participate in annual athletic meet, indoor and outdoor games, inter-collegiate football, volleyball, badminton, and cricket.

Cultural Committee

DBT STAR COLLEGE SCHEME

During the academic session 2022-23, Durgapur Government College was awarded the prestigious DBT STAR COLLEGE SCHEME by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. This scheme was awarded to six science departments of the institution, namely, **Botany, Chemistry, Geology, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology** with the objective to strengthen the infrastructural facilities and consequently promote the teaching and learning mechanism of the undergraduate science education primarily through practical learning experiences. Several activities such as **new experiments, workshops, student projects, seminars, conferences, and visits to research laboratories of national eminence, industrial training, invited lectures and outreach activities** have been conducted by these six departments under the scheme. The DBT Star College Scheme support has enabled the participating departments to **procure new equipment so that multiple copies of the equipment can be provided to the students for practical classes**. The new equipment, chemicals and consumables purchased for the undergraduate laboratories have enabled to **conduct new experiments and hands on experiments** giving them the opportunity to explore scientific understanding through experiential learning and critical thinking. The Scheme has enabled to amalgamate the expertise of departments and provide **interdisciplinary dimension to the teaching and learning process** and also use **ICT tools extensively**, which is one of the objectives of the modern education system. For example, bioactivity study through the computational chemistry, water collection through field visits followed by analysis by students of both biological as well as chemical sciences, excel workshop conducted by mathematics department for students of all participating departments for data handling and representation in their respective areas, workshop on remote sensing and its applications conducted by department of geology for students of all departments, visit to coal mines and geological survey of India (GSI, Kolkata) organized by geology department for students of all departments. Students of mathematical sciences have received hands on training on laboratory equipment of other departments through different workshops and training Programmes. This has enabled the mutual exchange of ideas among the students and faculty members. In the next session, more interdisciplinary activities have been planned under the scheme. The Scheme support has enabled conducting **several seminars, workshops and invited lectures by guest speakers and in-house faculty members**. This has facilitated the interaction of undergraduate students with scientists, eminent professors and research experts and accordingly promoted their research fundamentals and also motivated them towards the future scope of scientific studies. The support has also enabled conducting workshop for faculty members and non-teaching staff enabling them to improve their skills for application in academic and administrative activities. The celebration of World Soil Day and National Science Day and poster competition for students has motivated the scientific understanding of the students. The Scheme support has enabled conducting **industrial training, field visits and visits to research laboratories**. As a result, undergraduate students have got exposure to advanced instrumentation processes and demonstration of the working principle of the instruments, modern research facilities available in research institutes and industry practices. Faculty members have also participated in events and presented their research work. The Scheme support has enabled conducting outreach activities in which faculty members and undergraduate students of neighbouring institute have actively participated. These outreach activities have promoted the subject understanding, motivation and scientific study of the

students and faculty members of the institute. More outreach activities are also planned in the upcoming academic session under the scheme.
