


May 31, 2024: Online Seminar on "Ill Effects of Consuming Tobacco and its accompanying health hazards" organized by NSS Units I and II, IQAC Durgapur Government College in collaboration with Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of West Bengal





Dr. Debashish Halder, Joint Director of Health Services, Dept of Health and Family welfare, Government of West Bengal, an esteemed figure in the realm of healthcare, led the seminar and shed light on various aspects related to tobacco consumption. The topics covered included:

Introduction to World No Tobacco Day: The significance of World No Tobacco Day in highlighting the global health threats posed by tobacco and the importance of tobacco control measures.

Health Hazards of Tobacco Consumption: A comprehensive overview of the adverse health effects of tobacco on different organs and systems of the human body, including the lungs, heart, and oral cavity.

Impact on Public Health: Discussion on the broader public health implications of tobacco use, such as its contribution to noncommunicable diseases (NCDs) like cancer, cardiovascular diseases, and respiratory disorders.

Tobacco Control Policies and Interventions: Insights into the various tobacco control policies and interventions implemented by the government and non-governmental organizations to curb tobacco usage and promote tobacco cessation.

Role of Education and Awareness: Emphasis on the pivotal role of education and awareness campaigns in educating the masses about the dangers of tobacco consumption and fostering a societal shift towards tobacco-free lifestyles.

An engaging interactive session followed, where faculties from Durgapur Government College and also from other colleges, students all interacted with the resource person. The NSS volunteers got a clear idea about the topic and expressed their willingness to spread this awareness in the communities.

April 29, 2024: One Day outreach activity for local schools organized by NSS Unit-I and II Durgapur Government College and Industrial Training Institute, Durgapur and Maruti Suzuki India Ltd

The primary objective of the one-day outreach activity was to provide an orientation to the Head of the Institution and all teachers of local schools regarding the MarutiSuzuki On Job Training Program. This program is a part of the skill development initiative of the Central Government, aimed at bridging the gap between industry requirements and academic curriculum. The event was attended by principals, teachers and students of different schools in and around Durgapur Government college. A total of 42 participants graced the event. Teachers from the ITI college, Durgapur and members of the Maruti Suzuki on job training program gave a vivid description of the course, the stipend structure, scope of growth in this career and the expected status of the student in the forthcoming years if they joined this program. April 25, 2024: Awareness lecture and interactive session organized by Department of Zoology and NSS Units I and II to observe World Malaria Day

Two special lectures were organised to observe the World Malaria day on April 25, 2024. The first was on Malaria by Dr. Manas Paramanik, Assistant Professor of Animal Science, Kazi Nazrul University, and the second was on Mosquito: Public Enemy no 1 (WHO) by Dr. Kuntal Bhattacharya, Assistant Professor of ZoologyDurgapur Government College. Both the lectures were informative and our volunteers learnt methods to have a clean community. These cleanliness measures would in turn reduce the breeding places of mosquitos, which in turn would cause the decrease in the cases of malaria in the community at large. Very simple practices of throwing unused stagnant water, like water in vases, tyres, pots, clogged drains can cause a great change to the mosquito population. Planting plants like Lavender, Citronella Grass (Lemon Grass)

Catmint, Rosemary can easily keep away mosquitos. Another great mosquito repellent is rosemary, Scented Geranium. The NSS volunteers understood a lot about the root cause of Malaria and its preventive techniques and are well equipped to spread this awareness to the society at large.




Figure: Intimation regarding participation from the NSS Unit 1 and 2




Figure: Letter of acknowledgement from the organisers at the Youth Convention

The program commenced with an introduction by the organizers, emphasizing the significance of understanding and supporting individuals with disabilities in creating an inclusive society. The resource persons from SAHAS delivered a compelling talk, shedding light on the different types of disabilities, including physical, cognitive, and sensory impairments. Real-life examples, were given by one of the resource persons who himself is differently abled. In the interactive discussions, students gained a deeper understanding of the challenges faced by differently abled individuals and the importance of early diagnosis and intervention.

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March 04-11, 2024, NSS Volunteers during the survey of energy consumption for green audit in college campus and residential quarters

In line with its commitment to environmental sustainability and community service, the National Service Scheme (NSS) in association with the college campus environmental committee conducted a comprehensive green audit of the college campus. The green audit aimed to assess the campus's environmental impact, identify areas for improvement, and promote eco-friendly practices among students, faculty, and staff. This report presents the findings and recommendations derived from the green audit conducted by NSS. In order to prepare the green audit report of the college campus the NSS Unit I and II along with the college campus environmental committee organised a 8days long survey (4/3/2024 to 11/3/2024) of the total energy consumption of the entire college campus. Analysis of electricity usage was the focus of the survey. The volunteers recommended to implement energy-efficient lighting systems, upgrade to energy-efficient appliances, and conduct regular maintenance to reduce energy consumption.



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March 01, 2024, One-day survey and training program on "Mental Wellbeing of College Students" organized by NSS Unit I and II, and Students' Health, Welfare, and Psychological Counseling Cell in collaboration with IQ City Institute of Nursing Sciences, Durgapur, West Bengal

On March 1, 2024, the NSS Unit I and II, in collaboration with the Students' Health, Welfare, and Psychological Counseling Cell, organized a one-day survey and training program on "Mental Wellbeing of College Students." The event was held in partnership with the IQ City Institute of Nursing Sciences, located on IQ City Road, Durgapur, West Bengal. The program aimed to raise awareness about mental health issues among college students and equip participants with strategies to promote mental wellbeing.. Many students were benefitted by this program and NSS volunteers mostly female actively helped in the smooth conduct of the event. The main objectives were:

a. To assess the mental health status and challenges faced by college students.

b.To provide training on recognizing signs of mental distress and offering support.

c. To promote mental health awareness and destigmatize seeking help for psychological issues.

The day commenced with a survey conducted among college students to gather data on their mental health status, experiences, and challenges. The survey aimed to identify prevalent issues and concerns related to mental wellbeing. Expert speakers from the IQ City Institute of Nursing Sciences conducted training sessions on various aspects of mental health, including:

Understanding common mental health disorders such as anxiety, depression, and stress. Recognizing signs and symptoms of mental distress in oneself and others. Strategies for coping with stress and building resilience. Importance of seeking professional help and accessing mental health services.
