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INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE: 5.1.2023; on "Artifice and Inference: Mahima Bhatta on a Puzzle about Aesthetic Pleasure". JOINTLY ORGANIZED BY DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY AND DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH IN COLLABOARTION WITH IQAC DURGAPUR GOVERNMENT COLLEGE

SPEAKER: Dr. Nilanjan Das; Associate Professor of Philosophy at University of Toronto

The Department of Philosophy intends to frame a groundwork on which such critical discussion may well brood on relating to the intersection of Indian Philosophy with Indian form of Art and thus the students would find the Indian Knowledge system enormously rich. Dr. Nilanjan Das projected Mahima Bhatta's view of aesthetic emotion which he felt as a response to a work of literature which may be conveyed by way of inference. Dr. Das put forward Mahima Bhatta's attempt of solving the puzzle and his failure of solving it along with his own solution to decipher such puzzle via the Buddhist theory of yogic perception all made the international conference in tune with the Indian Knowledge system. Dr.Das also made clear Abhinavagupta's commentary on Bharata's Rasasūtra and profoundly spoke of the intersection of Indian Philosophy with Indian form of Art.






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Online Special Lecture organized on 9.4.2024; 'Mapping of Rene Descartes' Philosophical ideas as a Rationalist Philosopher';

SPEAKER: Dr. Priyanka De, Assistant Professor Department of Philosophy Presidency University

The theme of the online special lecture was the mapping of the Philosophical thoughts of the French philosopher and scientist; Rene Descartes born in March 31. 1596 France. The theme centred round issues like why Descartes was called a philosopher and a scientist, whom did he influence by his thoughts? What was he famous for? And how do we map all the thoughts that he propagated philosophically? The objective of the special lecture organized as an activity of the Special class allotted in the Routine was to make students aware about the works of a philosopher which earned him the title of a scientist as well. Students of Philosophy may study as a part of their syllabus about Rene Descartes as a Philosopher but they must also learn that there was in fact little difference between the courses or study back in the 17th century.
