MINI PHILOSOPHICAL CAFÉ SESSION WITH STUDENTS

OBJECTIVE OF THE SESSION: The objective of the session was to bring out the philosophical musings on one's existence. Students are many a times found to suppress the extreme ill feelings quietly nurtured within themselves which eventually may either lead to sever decisions taken in forms of suicidal attempts or may turn into intense low feeling even when they are in groups which are harsh to their mental health. Mentor Dr. Bhumika Kanjilal thought it to be better to choose an environment where the toil of the day would be reduced and where naturally students would be more prone to feel free to talk. Reading the young minds would thus be easy since it is extremely important to know what a student is thinking or undergoing as a person amongst his/ her peer group. As a Mentor Dr. Kanjilal felt that none of her students must be left out supposing him/her to shy/introvert/slow/unequipped. She felt that such ignorance on the part of the teacher may lead to consequences which bring about massive effects which affect the environment of the class. It was heavily felt that students should be inspired and made ready. It is easy to groom a fast learner but perhaps it is more selffulfilling for a teacher to groom and make a slow/ shy student equipped by showing a bit of intellectual empathy.




